# Bringing The Truth about Genocide and Abortion to Kennesaw State University

**A**pril is Genocide Awareness Month. The *Crescenta Valley Weekly* explains: “Many of the past centuries genocides began in April – Armenia, Germany (the Holocaust), Cambodia, Bosnia, Rwanda, Sudan.” <https://bit.ly/3k9db1i>

Accordingly, it is especially fitting when we take our Genocide Awareness Project to universities in April. The *World Atlas* reports that upwards of 75 million people have been killed in the top 15 genocidal campaigns since the Zungar Genocide began in 1758 in China. <https://bit.ly/3MKkVDD> Abortion is a genocide that kills 73 million children worldwide each year. <https://bit.ly/37CjVCa> . These staggering numbers demonstrate that the magnitude of the abortion genocide nearly matches the total numbers killed by all forms of genocide since 1758.

Kennesaw State University students had the opportunity to learn the truth about abortion and genocide when we brought our Genocide Awareness Project (GAP) on campus March 23-24, 2022. This was the first campus in a tour of five universities that began March 23 and wrapped up on April 7. Our display was set up in an excellent location and our signs were seen by all who passed. CBR continues to be the only anti-abortion organization regularly conducting large abortion photo displays on major university campuses.

As usual, many students stopped to talk. A new volunteer named Cynthia made a record of common questions students posed:  
1) What if the mother couldn't afford to give the baby a good life?

Isn't it more humane to abort? 2) If I were raped, why would I keep a baby that constantly reminded me of my rapist? 3) Why would I bring a baby into the world to give them up for adoption or into the foster care system where they wouldn't be cared for and would be abused? 4) How can you compare abortion to the Holocaust or slavery?

We train volunteers how to persuasively answer these and many more frequently asked questions. Volunteer Patty noted that many students bring up the “hard” cases; and their solution to hardship seems to be abortion. The babies pay the price for people's sin and for many of the woes of the world.

The following are comments we heard from those with open minds:

A student expressed, “This is just horrible; it makes me want to cry.”

One history major said, “I am anti-abortion. I speak up in philosophy class against abortion and the class gets quiet. But I am not as bold as you guys are.”

A freshman business major told us, “These pictures make me more informed.”

“Thank you for coming to our campus. Parents need to take care of their children.”

A psychology major named Gabe shared, “The most important thing is to witness Christ to these students.” Of course, we share our faith every time we see an opportunity to do so.

A student named Isabel was raised Catholic and asked our volunteer Brad what the Bible says about abortion. He asked volunteer Abigail to join the discussion, and she gave an insightful answer. Soon, Isabel's friend Dee joined in, asking questions and listening intently to Abigail and Brad.

One student expressed interest in starting a pro-life club. As often happens, GAP visits are our most effective tool for starting new campus pro-life groups which won't hide the horror of abortion.

Volunteer Patty decided that she will stay silent more next time and let the pictures be the strongest witness. We have long said that our pictures do the heavy lifting.

To the editor:

As one of the organizers of the Genocide Awareness Project (GAP) which made a recent appearance at Kennesaw State, I wanted to respond to the item that appeared in *The Cobb County Courier*.

Ironically, our detractors agree with us on the most important aspect of our campaign. They describe pictures of abortion as traumatic, bloody, and extreme. We agree. Abortion is all of those. Pictures of abortion are shocking because decapitating and dismembering a little human being is shocking. Anyone with a functioning conscience is appalled by such extreme violence. Is it logical to argue that the pictures of abortion are traumatic, but the act of abortion is somehow OK? Or that abortion is OK to do, but too extreme to see?

Unfortunately, the *Courier* never asked those who protested our display the most obvious question: If abortion is just a simple medical procedure with no moral significance, then why would a picture of it upset you so much? Here is the answer: Pictures upset them because they can't defend decapitating and dismembering a little child.

By printing baseless assertions by pro-abortion speakers, without any opportunity for rebuttal, your story alleges that we make misleading or false claims, both about abortion images and about abortion in the Black community. Exactly which facts about Black abortion are we misstating? Tell us. Let's have that conversation. Which of our statements about abortion generally are misleading? Tell us. Let's have that conversation, as well.

Your story called us 'extremist.' Maybe you're right, but you will have to explain why it is OK to decapitate and dismember a little human being, but 'extreme' to show a picture of it.



# CBR Reaching Younger Generation Through Social Media

**W**e have a presence on Facebook, Instagram and Twitter, platforms where we particularly aim to reach young people. Staff member Abra Singleton adds social media posts to these platforms three to five times a week. Some are in the form of “memes.” Memes are images, videos or pieces of text which are copied and spread rapidly by internet users. They are frequently humorous and can be slightly adjusted to fit the context. Due to the serious nature of abortion, most of our posts and tweets are not humorous, although sometimes humor works for us. Three recent CBR posts are included here, to the right.
